




Acts 4.32-37

The whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. With great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. There was not a needy person among them Now, for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold. They laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need. There was a Levite, a native of Cyprus, Joseph, to whom the apostles gave the name Barnabas (which means 'son of encouragement'). He sold a field that belonged to him, then brought the money, and laid it at the apostles' feet.

1 John 1.1-22

We declare to you what was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life— this life was revealed, and we have seen it and testify to it, and declare to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was revealed to us— we declare to you what we have seen and heard so that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. We are writing these things so that our joy may be complete.

This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him there is no darkness at all. If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us



When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.'

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'


Final Hymn





ABM Reflection: The Annunciation – Lady Day – Monday 8 April 2024 • Isaiah 7.10 -14; Psalm 40.6-13; Hebrews 10.4-10; Luke 1.26-38 Only ten days ago we stood at the cross with Mary, the mother of Jesus, as her dying son entrusted her care to the beloved disciple, just before he took his final breath. The image is visceral and haunting as the one who bore him, who has nursed and nurtured him, in that awful moment is powerless to care for or comfort her child, as he is dying an excruciating and humiliating death. He is "her child" even as he is the Son of God. He is that same child whom the Angel Gabriel announced would be conceived in her through the power of the Holy Spirit, because "nothing will be impossible with God." (Luke 1:37) What seemed impossible at the annunciation - a virgin who has not had any sexual partner who becomes pregnant, and what seemed impossible at the foot of the cross – a dying man who within three days defies the powers of sin and death once and for all, to rise from the dead, are absolutely possible. In God's mysterious way this impossible conquering of death announced that Jesus is exactly who he was prophesised to be (cf Isaiah 7:14), and he has fulfilled the promise of his name given to him by the Angel Gabriel: "God saves". • We pray for the worldwide Mother's Union today and give thanks for their ministry with families. • Give thanks for the work and witness of the Church of North India Text: The Rev Angela Peverell, Diocese of Newcastle © Anglican Board of Mission, 202

FROM THE SAFE MINISTRY UNIT

Module 1 is a course for all clergy and lay position holders to develop awareness of the Diocesan Safe Ministry policy, protocols, procedures, and practices. The training includes biblical foundations, healthy team ministry, screening, boundaries, code of conduct, duty of care, child safe practices, responding to concerns (child and adult related), and self-care as church workers.

Module 2 is a course for all children and youth workers (lay and clergy) to develop awareness of Child Safety and Child Protection. This course includes empowering children, identifying and responding to concerns (risk of harm), reducing the risks of child abuse, and caring for all parties.

Module 3 is a course for all clergy, Parish Council members, Parish Safe Ministry Coordinators (SMCs) and Ministry Program Coordinators aimed at working through the implementation of Dioce-

san Safe Ministry Policy, Protocols, and Procedures (in particular the Child Safe Standards, Reportable Conduct Scheme, screening of workers, Grievance Procedure, Professional Standards, and Ministry to Persons of Concern).

Online programs remain available for Modules 1 and 2 via the Creating Safer Communities website. Module 3 is only available through In-Person or Zoom sessions.

2. <u>Payment for In Person Training</u>: Attendees at the above sessions do not need to need to prepay or pay on the day. Instead, attendance at sessions will be recorded and Creating Safer Communities will invoice each Ministry Unit directly for the number of attendees from it.

While bookings are not necessary, if Ministry Units are able to give indications of attendance to the Safe Ministry Unit if will help us understanding the number of likely attendees at any given session.

3. Safe Ministry Training and Parish Elections: Can you please ensure that those elected as Parish Councillors and Wardens understand their obligation to complete Safe Ministry Training and Screening to hold Office (they are Category 3A Church Workers under the Diocese's Protocol for Safe Ministry Screening and Training (SM002-Screening-Protocol.pdf (anglicancg.org.au). We are requesting that all necessary training including Module 3 be completed no later than June 2024, and that Wardens and Parish Counsellors remember their obligation to also create and maintain their Safe Ministry Information System (SMIS) profile.
