Now when the king was settled in his house, and the LORD had given him rest from all his enemies around him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'See now, I am living in a house of cedar, but the ark of God stays in a tent.' Nathan said to the king, 'Go, do all that you have in mind; for the LORD is with you.'

But that same night the word of the LORD came to Nathan: Go and tell my servant David: Thus says the LORD: Are you the one to build me a house to live in? I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent and a tabernacle. 
Singers needed for 2024

Prayer for the Israel /Palestine conflict

They say: "our beloved Holy Land has changed dramatically over the past, We are witnessing a new cycle of violence with an unjustifiable attack against all civilians. Tensions continue to rise and more innocent and vulnerable people are paying the ultimate price as the dramatic level and death and destruction in Gaza clearly show."

The Anglican Archbishop in Jerusalem, the Most Revd Hosam Naoum, Vice Chair of the Anglican Communion Standing Committee, is a member of the Patriarchs and Heads of Churches in Jerusalem group. In his own statement, he said: "we pray without ceasing for justice, reconciliation, peace, and an end to hatred and war. We also pray for God to change the hearts of all leaders and decision-makers in our countries and around the world, For we are in dire need or hearts that love, show mercy, and are willing to live in unity with others – hearts that respect human dignity and choose life rather than death."

The Secretary General of the Anglican Communion, Bishop Anthony Poggo, has endorsed the call for a day of prayer and fasting, and is calling on Anglicans around the world to take part, saying: "Archbishop Hosam, and his ecumenical colleagues in the Patriarchs and Heads of Churches group, are in the front line of the Christian response to the ongoing catastrophe in Israel and the Gaza strip.

"I join them in calling on Christians around the world to join together in prayer, in the words of Archbishop Hosam, "for justice, reconciliation, peace, and an end to hatred and war."



Canon Anne writes:

Nazareth is never once mentioned in the Old Testament.

Nothing of any importance ever happened there; no one of any significance had ever lived there. God's choice of David and Mary reflects a recurring pattern in Israel's history: "Now again, He by-passed academics, clergy, politicians, judges, councillors, to rest His favour on simple unlettered folk: farm-workers, fishermen, shepherds, donkey-drivers, peddlers, tanners, tax-collectors, beggars, harlots. All of them without influence, power, prestige.

Two teenagers became pivotal in God's plan, and for each of them that plan reaches fulfilment through God's supreme power. David desired to build a house (temple) for the Lord, but is promised instead that God will establish a house (dynasty) for him.

That promise comes to its fulfilment in Mary's gracious acceptance, 'Let what you have said be done to me.'"

Advent 4 - Mary and child. There is a lovely story told by a priest whose church building was so small that at Christmas time every available chair was needed and the nativity crib was placed under the altar. One Christmas morning, about halfway through the service, a little girl, Miriam, toddled up to the front of the church. She can only have been about two or three. For several minutes she stood before the crib, gazing intently at the figures. Then, very carefully, so as not to wake the baby, she stepped inside and sat down. And as people looked at the crib that Christmas, as well as the shepherds and the angels and the ox and the ass, and Mary and Joseph and the baby Jesus, they saw Miriam. She sat there for the rest of the service, content to have become part of the story.

Now that all the preparations are done, let us give ourselves time to become part of the story too. Let us be still, and like Miriam get inside the story, there in Bethlehem.

We can find the Christ in stillness. We can find him in silence. And Christmas can be put back together and enjoyed.
