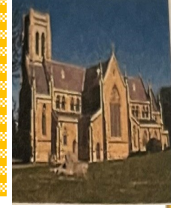

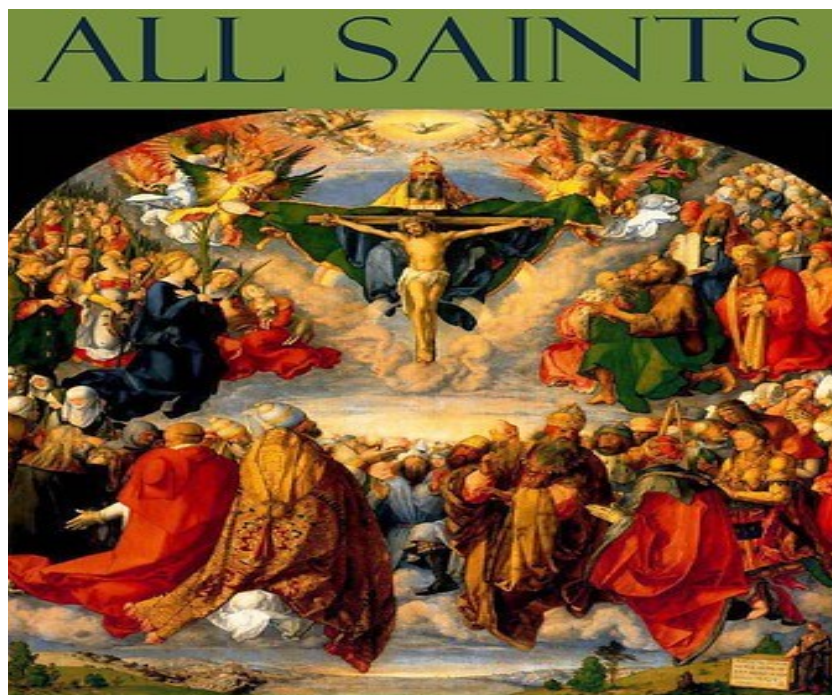

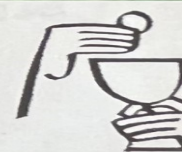

After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying,

All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven. Although millions, or even billions of people may already be saints, All Saints' Day observances tend to focus on known saints --that is those recognized in the canon of the saints by the Catholic Church. All Saints' Day is also commemorated by members of the Eastern Orthodox Church as well as some protestant churches, such as Lutheran and Anglican churches. All Saints' Day was formally started by Pope Boniface IV, who consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the Virgin Mary and all the Martyrs on May 13 in 609 AD. Boniface IV also established All Souls' Day, which follows All Saints.

What is All Souls' Day?

All Souls' Day is also known as the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed and the [Day of the Dead](#). It's a day of prayer and remembrance and on All Souls' Day, people celebrate the lives and souls of those who have died.

All Souls' Day is celebrated widely by Christians on November 2nd, following All Saints' Day.

What happens on All Souls' Day?

The beliefs and practices that are associated with All Souls' Day vary across the different Christian denominations. In 1915, Pope Benedict XV gave permission for priests to celebrate three masses on All Souls' Day. This makes it the only other day besides Christmas Day with that distinction.

Churches are often decorated in black, as this is the colour most often associated with death. Parishioners commonly light candles in memory of loved ones and sometimes write the names of the departed in a special commemorative book. Church bells also ring on All Souls' Day, as it's believed that the sound will comfort the dead and cleanse them.

In European countries, it used to be a tradition for children to go 'souling' on the eve of All Souls' Day. They would exchange prayers for the lost souls for currant-filled buns called soulcakes.

Some believe that the origins of All Souls' Day in Europe are related to customs of ancestor veneration which is practised worldwide through events such as the Indian Pitru Paksha, Ghost Festival in China and the Bon Festival in Japan.
