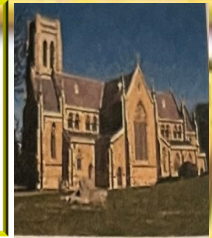

Ezekiel 34.11-16,20-24

For thus says the Lord GOD: I myself will search for my sheep, and will seek them out. As shepherds seek out their flocks when they are among their scattered sheep, so I will seek out my sheep. I will rescue them from all the places to which they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them into their own land; and I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the watercourses, and in all the inhabited parts of the land. I will feed them with good pasture, and the mountain heights of Israel shall be their pasture; there they shall lie down in good grazing land, and they shall feed on rich pasture on the mountains of Israel. 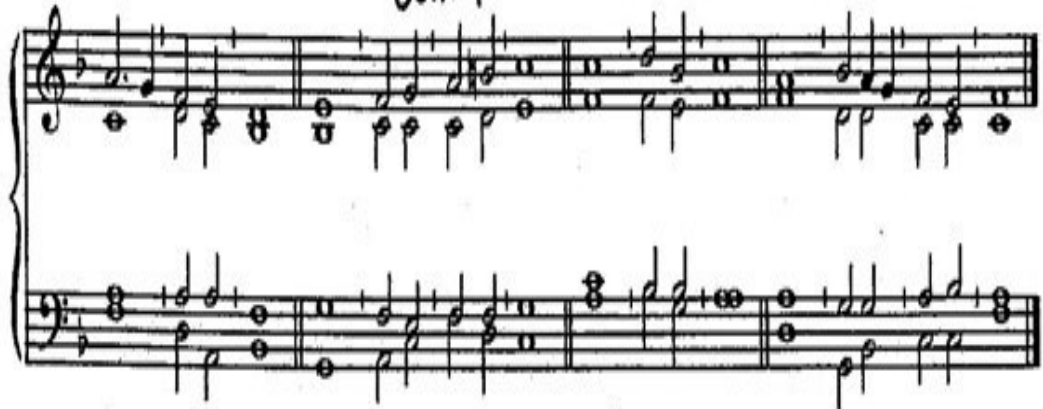

Matthew 25.31-46

When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. Then the king will say to those at his right hand, "Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." Then the righteous will answer him, "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?" part from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.” Then they also will answer, “Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?” Then he will answer them, “Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.” And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.’

ABM REFLECTION Ordinary Sunday 34 A [Christ the King] – Sunday 26 November 2023 • Ezekiel 34.11-16, 20-24; either Psalm 100 or 95.1-7; Ephesians 1.15-23; Matthew 25.31-46 The image of Christ as King can seem antithetical to how we see and understand Jesus. He is not concerned about power and status but rather caring for all with food, drink, clothing and welcome. This image is replicated by the prophet Ezekiel with God as shepherd searching for and seeking out the sheep. Canon Anne writes:



Today is the Feast of Christ the King and it is this cathedral's Patronal Festival. It is a day to celebrate our ministry and mission. One of the most common words in the Bible is gratitude, appearing 157 times. The closely related word 'thanksgiving' appears 72 times. The latter is an action. What is clear is when we realise the goodness of God shown in his lavish provision for us, we cannot help but be grateful. There is no way we can ever pay back to God what he has given us. Instead, like a child we can only respond in thanksgiving and praise.

Today, we are reflecting on, and celebrating all the things God has done amongst and through us this year. We are thankful for new members and for our growth in spiritual maturity. We are thankful for the significant number who serve in the sanctuary, and for new and existing ministries. We are thankful for new friendships, for answered prayers and for being sustained physically and spiritually week by week in the breaking open of the Word. We are thankful to be part of this community, our parish. Praise God who has given us every spiritual blessing in Christ.

The words of the Psalm give us strength, courage and humility for our pilgrimage. The Gospel is about the end of time, the coming of the Son of Man, and the final judgment at the conclusion of our liturgical year, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King.

Pope Pius XI instituted the Solemnity of Christ the King in 1925 as a reminder that Christ reigns above all earthly rulers. While temporal powers will fade away, Christ's reign and his kingdom remain eternal. As the Messiah, Jesus was called the Son of David. And during His trial and crucifixion, He was identified as the King of the Jews. The other sense of Christ's fulfillment of this role is more cosmic in nature. God has always been King over His creation, whether in heaven or on earth.
