

The Sacrament of Reconciliation

Lent is a time of reflection and preparation for the great events of our salvation, and so the priests in the Cathedral are available to exercise this ministry of confession and godly counsel.

To avail yourself of this opportunity simply speak to one of our priests.

Lent is the Christian season of Preparation before Easter.

Its original and ongoing purpose is teaching beginners about the faith.

In Western Christianity, Ash Wednesday marks the first day, or the start of the season of Lent, which begins 40 days prior to Easter Lent is a time when many Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of fasting, repentance, moderation and spiritual discipline. The purpose is to set aside time for reflection on Jesus Christ - his suffering and his sacrifice, his life, death, burial and resurrection.
