Why do we celebrate the saints?

Because they encourage us in our closer following of the Lord Jesus.

Luke is traditionally thought of as a physician. He focuses more than other Gospel writers on Jesus' ministry with women, and His ministry of healing.

Luke is mentioned in other parts of the New Testament, in the rather plaintive Epistle reading for today, and other letters of Paul, as well as in his second book - Acts - where at several stages the narrative changes from *they* to *we*.

Clearly Luke was at the forefront in the early spread of the Gospel and is the perhaps the only Gentile to write in the New Testament.
