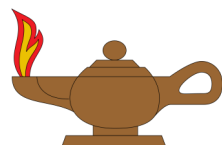

and their blood shall be precious in his sight.



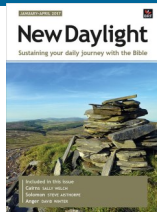
Food Pantry

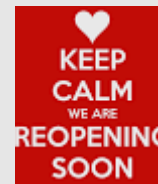
