Welcome to **Grace Isabelle Esson** and her family and friends. Grace is being baptised at 10am Service this morning.



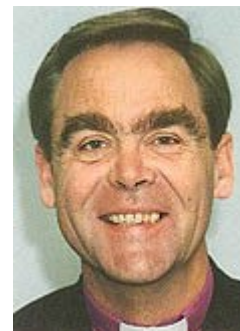

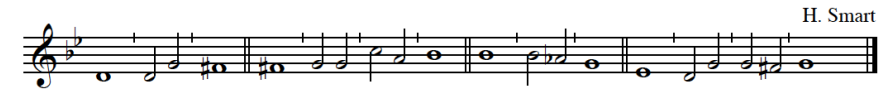
