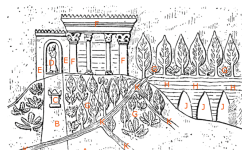

100th Anniversary of The Consecration of the Cathedral

When the new Bishop +Lewis Radford arrived in Goulburn in 1915 he discovered that the Cathedral had not been consecrated. There was a minimal amount owing and so it was duly paid, and the Cathedral was consecrated in 1916. Today we will be remembering this milestone in our Intercessions.
