Making Disciples



The Journey

It is time again for the Cathedral parish to begin gathering people for *The Journey*. *The Journey* is based on the Catechumenate, the method used in the early church to form disciples. The aim is to move people on *The Journey* through questions like: Who is Jesus anyway?;

What is the church about?

To: How can I serve?;

What ministry can I offer?

The Journey is a process, not a program. It begins with the needs of the candidates and brings Christ to them, where they are. People enter *The Journey* to faith from many entry points. Some are: life changes - such as moving house; changing jobs; crises and tragedies; life questions such as why am I here, what am I meant to do with my life; rites of passage - baptism of a child, confirmation, marriage and sometimes - curiosity. In *The Journey*, they ask their questions and they are answered in the context of our faith and life in Christ.

The Journey is a way to form disciples, who become genuinely committed to Christ and his community and renew the parish life along the way. It is about coming to faith, or returning to faith, in the context of the average parish community, and living out faith there.

Mainly Music meet in the Cathedral Office (Room 2)

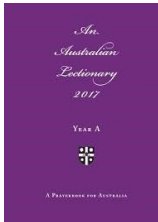
Mainly Music meet every Friday (except school holidays)
