'Then Jesus said to the disciples...' The parables Jesus told, and that are recorded in the Gospels, were specific to his hearers, their background and lifestyle. So it is sometimes difficult for Western, English-speaking 21st century readers to untangle them. Interestingly, this parable here is given different headings by different translators and commentators: 'the dishonest steward', 'the unjust steward', 'the unrighteous steward', more recently 'dishonest manager' and finally 'the shrewd manager'. He is the central character in the story – an anti-hero. The parable story is followed by several 'sayings' commenting on the story – trying to make sense of this character. Perhaps the moral of the parable, as viewed in our modern commercial world, is that those 'of the world' – operating in their environment – are farsighted – hence shrewd, prudent, looking to survival. The 'children of light', those concerned with 'spiritual' matters should be ready in their relationships to promote 'heavenly' things.
