From our Organist, Robert Smith.....

TODAY'S VOLUNTARY. In 1878, five years earlier than our famous Forster and Andrews organ, Henri Mulet was born in Paris in the shadow of the wondrous new Byzantine Basilica of Sacre Coeur, Montmartre where eventually he became his choirmaster father's assistant at the harmonium and successor.

A pupil of Widor, Vierne and Guilmant, he was described as a strange and great artist, captive of a mystic ideal. He became an organ professor and organist of various prestigious Paris churches, deriving enormous inspiration from the Sacre Coeur architecture that resulted in his fine suite for organ "Ten Byzantine Sketches". The final piece's heading "Tu Es Petra" includes this quotation from today's Gospel reading "Upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it". It portrays an exciting struggle of good and evil with the final dramatic triumph of good.

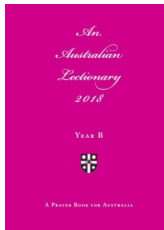

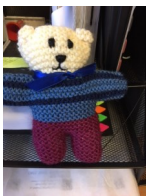
ORDERS NOW BEING TAKEN 2018 LECTIONARY
