Just our general items now to maintain our levels:

Items Needed: 1ltr Longlife Milk, tinned meals, soups, pasta (any variety), pasta sauce, tinned tuna/salmon, baked beans & spaghetti, biscuits/crackers (dry as substitute for bread).

Restoration news: Scaffolding and entrance tunnels have been constructed at the north and south entrance doors and these will stay in place until mid March. We will continue to enter the Cathedral through the south door tunnel.

Necessary changes have been made in the Cathedral nave and narthex to enable dismantling of the font.

This means the welcomers' table, Guest book and other items have had to be relocated for the next 5 months and while it may be an inconvenience, it is necessary, for health and safety issues are involved.
