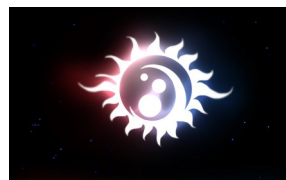

look down on mortal men.

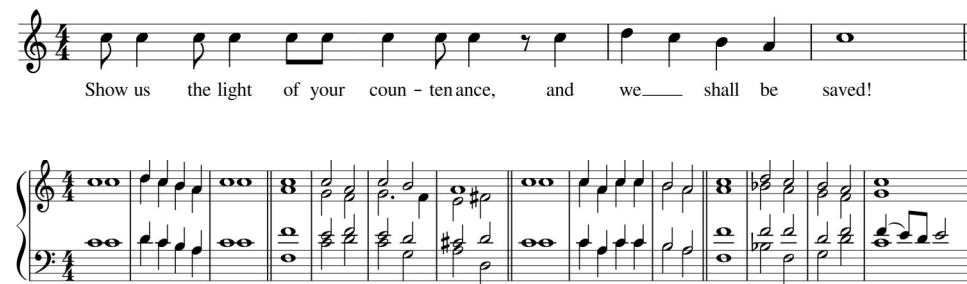
