therefore give us love.

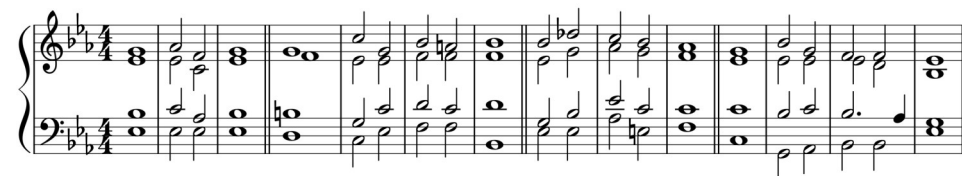
