Often when we come to the word of God, we can be confronted by what we find inside. Today in the reading from Nehemiah, we find that when the prophet Ezra read the scroll in the presence of the people, they wept because of their disobedience. Similarly, in the Gospel, we read how attentive the people in the synagogue were to Jesus as he went to preach in the synagogue, but as we will hear next Sunday, would turn on him later on. We should learn to see the scriptures as a great mercy from God through which we are able to learn more about his love for us. This love can be confronting, but it is never a cause for mourning or hopelessness.
