Paul implies that the gospel is for all people, mentioning that it is being proclaimed everywhere and is changing people's lives. It proves its power in the love that people show to one another and to others – being the neighbour that Jesus challenges the lawyer (and us) to be in today's Gospel.

This is extra challenging when we realise that part of the point of Jesus' story is that even our enemies are our neighbours.

Thus, the parable is the supreme example of both love for neighbour and love for enemies.

to be a pilgrim.


