

The next **Cathedral Community Market** will be held on **Saturday August 5th**. Help is needed with setting up next Friday between 3 and 5pm, with manning the Cathedral tables between 9am and 1pm on Saturday and also with packing up afterwards. Even if you can only help for an hour or so, it would be greatly appreciated. All monies raised are used for the work of the Cathedral.

WHAT A DAY FOR A RIDE!!!

We have completed the first stage of the restoration program with the completion of the groundworks and provision for disability access at a cost of some \$440,000. Have you noticed there is no damp smell in the Cathedral? This is a sign of the drying out of the ground due to the new groundworks.

The **second stage** . Last Thursday an inspection of all finials, crosses and parapets by crane was carried out. A

number of them are in need of repair, and the engineer recommended the removal of several pieces of stone immediately for safety reasons. This was done. You may have noticed the cross at the crest of the roof at the Great West Doors has been removed. A new one will be carved and replaced. The cost of this next stage of restoration, approximately \$500,000. Our appeal remains open. ...Dean
