Justice:

Today we join Jesus in the country of the Gerasenes, opposite Galilee. We meet a man 'who had demons' – perhaps what we might describe as suffering from some kind of mental illness. Jesus heals him of his affliction and restores him to his rightful place in his community. Though the swine-herds and townspeople are scared by Jesus' restorative act, the cured man wants to spend time with Jesus. But Jesus has another priority for him: to go out and give others hope by declaring the good news of God's healing. Spending time with Jesus is good, but not at the expense of proclaiming God's kingdom.
