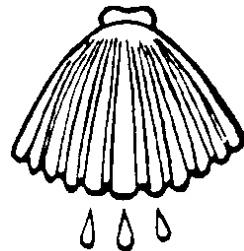

and night is turned to day.

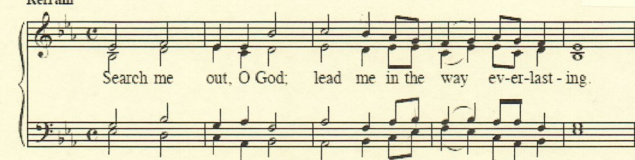
In Christ all races meet,

come, Prince of Peace, and reign.

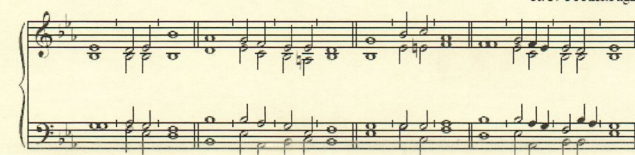
