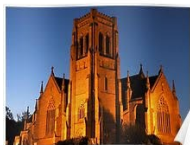

if our God our Father be.

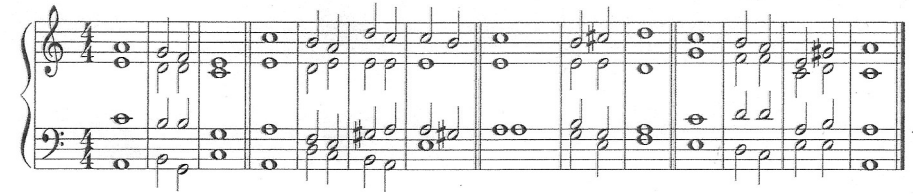
Saviour, breathe forgiveness o'er us;
