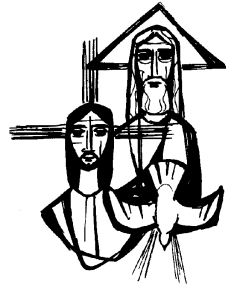

How long, Lord, How long?

Our state government has now started the process of allowing the first stages of reopening our state.

However, for churches to reopen there have been various restrictions placed on us - as with other venues. Before we reopen the Government and the Diocese require us to develop a plan.

The guidelines for such a plan come to some 14 pages, and include such details as: appointing a person or group to oversee the Plan; a seating plan with appropriate distancing, supervision of distancing measures; the taking of contact details for all present on each occasion; disinfecting of surfaces and equipment after each event; controlling entries and exits and no singing or chanting.

All these measures are necessary if we want to avoid a second wave of outbreaks.

There is a second set of issues which are even more important, I believe. Most of our church community are in one or other of the *vulnerable group* categories and so we need to be very careful in our actions.

Meeting with the Wardens last Thursday, we decided to work on a Plan and that a wiser course would be not to open until at least the end of June.

We will monitor the situation in the meantime.

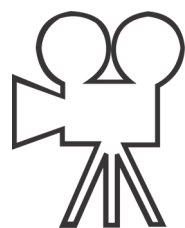
The madness at the supermarkets appears to have eased and a more "normal" approach to shopping has returned. Returned also to the shelves is the toilet paper. Please

continue to support as you can.

Standard items: Particularly tinned baked beans and longlife milk 1ltr.

Tinned/pkt soups, tinned meals (braised steak, Irish stew, curried sausages etc), tins/ pack fruits (peaches/pears etc), tinned spaghetti, pasta (any variety) and pasta sauce (any variety). Tins Spam/ham/corned beef, tinned tuna/salmon, tinned vegetables, crackers (bread substitute).

We will NOT be providing TOILET ROLLS, so please do not shop for them for our pantry.
