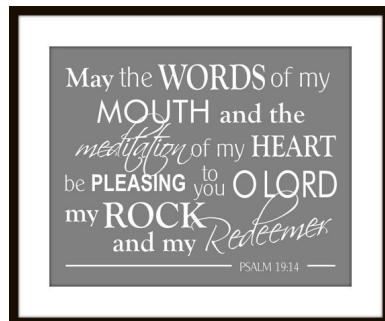

him, through love, to glorify.

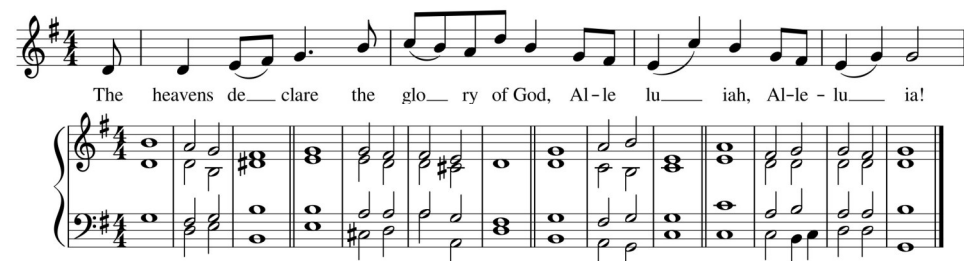

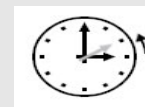
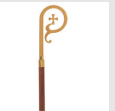
