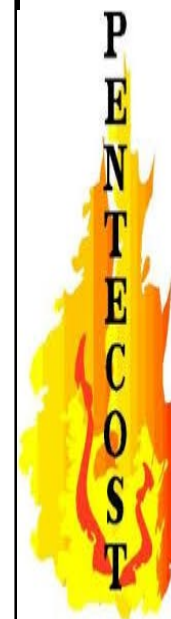

Next Sunday we will celebrate Pentecost Sunday....wear something "RED".



At Pentecost we celebrate the coming of Holy Spirit on the early followers of Jesus. Before the events of the first Pentecost, which came a few weeks after Jesus' death and resurrection, there were followers of Jesus, but no movement that could be meaningfully called "the church". Thus, from an historical perspective, Pentecost is the day on which the church was started. This is also true from a spiritual point of view, since the Spirit brings the church into existence and enlivens it. So Pentecost is the birthday of the Church!

The English word "Pentecost" is a transliteration of the Greek word *pentekostos*, which means "fifty". It comes from the ancient Christian

expression *pentekoste hemera*, which means "fiftieth day". This name comes from an expression in Leviticus 23:16, which instructs people to count seven weeks or "fifty days" from the end of Passover to the beginning of the next holy day.

The importance of the Day of Pentecost is that because of the death and resurrection of Jesus, the Spirit was given to all his followers to empower them to spread his Gospel in word and deed.

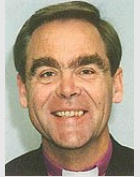
