praise.

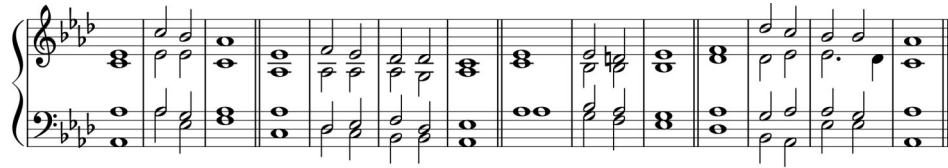

Thanks to the generous call for assistance from our Cathedral community and supportive community members our pantry shelves are well stocked just now.

#### Standard items to maintain our levels:
