FEAST OF MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS



St Michael frequently appears on the tops of spires in Europe and on buildings on high places such as Mont St Michel in France and St Michael's Tower on Glastonbury Tor in England. And there is a dramatic representation of the event described in the 2nd Reading on the wall of Coventry Cathedral.

However, the 'supreme' authority belongs to the 'Ancient One' whom the angels serve and the 'one like a human being' / 'God and his Messiah' / the one recognised by Nathanael as 'the Son of God' and 'the King of Israel'.

To ensure our Cathedral remains open to visitors and our community we need more Guides or Minders. Could you assist?? Training is given.

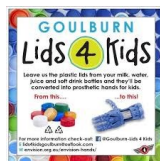
Our aim is to **open daily 10am-4pm (Shifts: 10am-1pm, 1-4pm).**
