our relationship with him.


**Palestine Fair Trade Products:**

As a way of supporting our sister-church friendship with St George's in East Jerusalem and the Palestinian people, the Cathedral shop has in stock a limited range of Palestine Fair Trade products. We have stocked four items: olive oil; olive oil soap; a spice mix similar to dukka; and a sun-dried tomato and caper spread.


**MINISTRY of HOSPITALITY – Cathedral Guides:**
