Acts 11.22-30,13.1-3

News of this came to the ears of the church in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. When he came and saw the grace of God, he rejoiced, and he exhorted them all to remain faithful to the Lord with steadfast devotion; for he was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. And a great many people were brought to the Lord. Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, and when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. So it was that for an entire year they met with the church and taught a great many people, and it was in Antioch that the disciples were first called 'Christians'. At that time prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. One of them named Agabus stood up and predicted by the Spirit that there would be a severe famine over all the world; and this took place during the reign of Claudius. The disciples determined that according to their ability, each would send relief to the believers living in Judea; this they did, sending it to the elders by Barnabas and Saul.

Now in the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon who was called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen a member of the court of Herod the ruler, and Saul. While they were worshipping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, 'Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.' Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off.



Safe Ministry Training Update

Since 2018 there have been substantial changes in the legislative landscape (such as the Child Safe Standards, and updates in both civil and criminal law) that have resulted in the course being updated. Therefore, as a matter of importance can I ask that all clergy and senior parish leaders (ie: Wardens and Parish Counsellors, etc) have attended a Level 3 Course either in person or through Zoom as soon as it practicable.

As Level 3 training about Implementation of Safe Ministry Policy and procedures at a Parish level we recommend that you attend together as a parish council and/or ministry team (either in person or via Zoom).
