**FIRST READING**

Reading from Genesis Chapter 18 beginning at 1st Verse  
The LORD appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. He said, 'My lord, if I find favour with you, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant.' So they said, 'Do as you have said.' And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah, and said, 'Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes.' Abraham ran to the herd, and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it. Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared, and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree while they ate.

They said to him, 'Where is your wife Sarah?' And he said, 'There, in the tent.' Then one said, 'I will surely return to you in due season, and your wife Sarah shall have a son.'

And Sarah was listening at the tent entrance behind him. Now Abraham and Sarah were old, advanced in age; it had ceased to be with Sarah after the manner of women. So Sarah laughed to herself, saying, 'After I have grown old, and my husband is old, shall I have pleasure?' The LORD said to Abraham, 'Why did Sarah laugh, and say, "Shall I indeed bear a child, now that I am old?"

Is anything too wonderful for the LORD? At the set time I will return to you, in due season, and Sarah shall have a son.' But Sarah denied, saying, 'I did not laugh'; for she was afraid. He said, 'Oh yes, you did laugh.'

SECOND READING

Reading from ROMANS Chapter 5 beginning at 1st Verse

Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God.

And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly.

Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.

Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life. But more than that, we even boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew  
Chapter 9 beginning at 35th Verse.

**GLORY TO YOU LORD JESUS CHRIST**

Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest.'

Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness.

These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax-collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

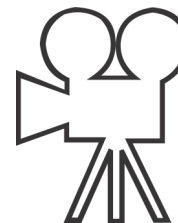
Sue is working in the office **Monday, Tuesday and Friday**, now our computer issues have been sorted. **Hours 9am-12noon**

## Food Pantry Needs

### CATHEDRAL MINISTRIES:

#### MINISTRY of COMMUNITY SERVICE:

Please **NO MORE MILK** at this time. We have large stock and have to adhere to **USE BY DATE** so until further notice please **DO NOT BUY MILK** for the pantry.

Standard items: All stocks are healthy so cut down your shop for next 3-4 weeks.

Tinned/pkt soups, tinned meals (braised steak, Irish stew, curried sausages etc), tins/pack fruits (peaches/pears etc), tinned spaghetti, pasta (any variety) and pasta sauce (any variety). Tins Spam/ham/corned beef, tinned tuna/salmon, tinned vegetables, crackers (bread substitute).

**REMEMBER:** We will **NOT** be providing **TOILET ROLLS**, so please do not shop for them for our pantry.

#### The Finials are wrapped

Dear friends,

Despite the arrival of winter in Goulburn, the work of the Cathedral continues.

If you have passed the Cathedral in the last couple of weeks you may have noticed some activity on the building and the fact that the mesh fence around the east end of the Cathedral has been removed.

Finials - carved stone pinnacles on the roof of the cathedral - and crosses on the roof, have been in danger of falling and have been wrapped. This is a safety measure. However, in the medium term the finials and crosses will need to be replaced.

The stonemasons have also installed "telldales" around the Great East Window. These will detect any movement in the wall surrounding the window and help us to assess the best way forward.

In this post-Pentecost season may the Spirit of God move among us and bring renewed life and dedication in our Cathedral community
